## The things that make for peace

About once a month I am the invited speaker at our Monday afternoon ‘Open Door’. I really enjoy the group. We often have a good discussion and everyone is happy to join in - even when we get crafty! One of the topics for our discussion during Lent was ‘peace’.

What do we mean by peace? Words such as ‘harmony’, ‘quiet’, ‘friendship’, nonviolence came to mind. But like the word ‘love’ we discover in the Bible that there are different understandings of ‘peace’.

In the Old Testament the Hebrew word for peace is Shalom. God was training up his people to understand that they needed rules and to learn the cause and effect of sin and goodness. The peace of Shalom in these Old Testament times implied outward security and material prosperity. The peace of Shalom is conditional on outward circumstances.

*‘He grants peace within your borders;  
he fills you with the finest of wheat.’ Ps 147.14*

In the New Testament we find that there are two meanings for peace. The Greek word Hesychia implies the English eternal understanding of peace – ‘peace and quiet’. Hesychia, like Shalom is conditional on external factors not ‘disturbing the peace and quiet’ and therefore cannot exist where there is fighting, noise or disturbances. It might be the sort of peace found on the Sea of Galilee when all is calm, all is still. This kind of peace is passive and inactive and interestingly is an understanding of peace that is rarely referred to in the New Testament. Two verses from 1 Timothy 2. 1 – 2 suggest this kind of peace:

*‘First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions,  
and thanksgivings should be made for everyone, <sup>2</sup>for kings and all  
who are in high positions, so that we **may lead a quiet and  
peaceable life in all godliness and dignity.**’*

There is only this one reference to this kind of peace in the New Testament. Therefore the peace Jesus came to bring must mean a different kind of peace. Eirene is the Greek word for the peace of Christ. This is the inner peace that comes from having Jesus at the centre of our lives. It is an inner peace that looks outward. Jesus is our peace and this peace is independent of external factors. We can know this peace when all around is in turmoil.

It may arise from that active stillness before God, listening first, being so at peace and at one with God, that we are enabled to bring about Eirene peace in whatever situation. Always obedient to, and at one with, his Father, Jesus lived with insecurity and in poverty for 3 years; but even in the eye of a storm he was at peace. Jesus was at peace even as he journeyed towards Jerusalem.

**‘Peace I leave with you – MY peace I give to you.’ (John 14.27)**

May we all know the peace of Christ in our hearts this Easter.

## **Wartime Memories - How I traced Mina** **by Patricia Graham (Church member 1940-1990)**

In 1939 a little Jewish girl came to England from Vienna. She was looked after by a couple who lived several doors away from my Grandma. (This was in Leigh-on-Sea, where I was born in 1927 and lived until 1940.

Her name was Mina and she was the same age as me. She came to my school, where she soon learned English and joined in everything. She had left her mother, father and brother behind. The deaths of her mother and father in extermination camps are recorded, but I don't know what happened to her brother.

For several years I had been trying to find out about her, with no reply from Southend Council, Southend Synagogue or Leigh Library, but then in 2015 or 2016 I saw a documentary on BBC1 about Nicholas Winton who had rescued hundreds of children from Czechoslovakia. After the programme the phone number of the Jewish Refugee Association was shown, so I phoned them. Within 10 minutes I had all the information I wanted. I couldn't believe my luck!

I then asked my friend to email the New York Refugee Association and got the details of Mina and her daughter, Hedi, to whom I sent all the information I had.

Mina is in Florida, but she seems to have blocked out all her early years. Hedi is very pleased to know her family's history. She has sent me a letter and Christmas greetings.

I am still on the trail, trying to find out how many children came to Southend? Why there? and many other questions. Next I have to arrange to go to Southend and look up the local paper for 1938-39 and I might get the last details.

### **GWEN GENTRY 1927-2017**

Gwen's funeral took place at Clock House Road Church on Friday, 17th February 2017.

Our Minister, Revd. Barbara Calvert, read a letter of tribute to Gwen which had been written by Hilda Hannaford, a life-long friend of Gwen, and who is a member of West Wickham Methodist Church.

Hilda writes: 'When I think of my good friend Gwen the letter 'C' seems to leap out to me, for Gwen was a committed Christian who was always Cheerful, who Cared deeply for family and friends and animals, and who was the most contented person I have known.

As an example of Gwen's cheerfulness I recall the occasion when our two families had decided to share a holiday. Gwen's husband, Denis, had acquired a second-hand car, an old 'banger' in which they were to travel to the holiday destination, which was in the Welsh borders. Our car got there safely but it was some time before Gwen and Denis's old banger came spluttering up the road. They had endured a series of breakdowns and disasters which Gwen related with much merriment. She turned what should have been a nightmare into a fun journey, full of exciting moments, and it made our hassle-free journey seem boring!

Her caring nature was shown in many ways. She was a devoted mother and grandmother and daughter. When her mother became housebound with crippling arthritis, Gwen turned her dining room into a bed sitting room with en suite facilities and Gwen nursed her mother devotedly for the rest of her mother's life. In contrast, when her son Geoffrey's wife had a baby girl, Gwen shared the caring of the baby with the other grandmother, thus enabling the baby's mother to continue with her job which she enjoyed. The situation was repeated when the second child, a boy, was born and Gwen loved her grandchildren and rejoiced that she had been able to contribute to their upbringing.

As for contentment, I never heard her speak enviously of anybody or anything. When her contemporaries were booking holidays abroad Gwen and Denis chose to explore England, which they loved. In fact I can only think of one visit abroad that they took and that was a two day excursion to see the Dutch bulb fields. As long as Gwen had her cosy home with a garden filled with flowers, a healthy family to love and care for and a dog, then she was rich beyond words.'

Denis and Gwen were Cub Leader and Assistant Cub Leader respectively at Bromley Road for many years. They were also both on the committee of Abbeyfield at Thornsett Road and following the closure of that home, and the death of Denis, Gwen served on the committee of the Queens Road house.

## CONCERT BY BECKENHAM JUNIOR CHOIR AND BECKENHAM YOUTH VOICES
