## **Reflections on ministry**

**May 2017**

Each month Jenny, Sheila, Mary Sawyer, Comfort, David McLeod and I visit Hall Grange MHA to lead a short morning service. We all enjoy going. It is good to worship together and to chat to the residents. I think to myself that if I am in a MHA home one day when I'm elderly and frail, I do hope some people will come in to lead worship each morning. So you can see my thoughts are turning towards old age! I remember in February we took the theme for our Hall Grange service of the elderly pair, Simeon and Anna. In Luke's gospel we are told that Simeon had waited all his life to behold 'the Lord's Messiah' and then the day arrives when Mary and Joseph enter the temple in Jerusalem cradling their infant son. Simeon's faithfulness was rewarded but as in so much of life his joy is tinged with sadness as he has foresight of the hard and painful road that lies ahead. This beautiful story from Luke is in my mind as I write my reflections on ministry. It's not all joy!

I was baptised at Shepherds Bush church, and grew up at the church in Love Lane, Pinner. Our family never missed a Sunday and we even took our Sunday School 'star cards' on holiday to Cornwall so that we could get our stamp at Polzeath Methodist Church. My first claim to fame occurred when at the age of seven I was chosen to present the bouquet to our retiring minister's wife at Pinner, Mrs Saunders. I remember this involved learning to curtsy. I was very proud to see my photograph in the 'Harrow Observer'.

In those days the women I admired in leadership in the church were our Sunday School teachers and returning missionaries. So this is what I aspired to. I was a Sunday School teacher from the age of 16 and then an RE teacher and the desire to travel overseas for the church was fulfilled when I worked for some years for Christian Aid. I sensed for a while an inner voice calling me to the ordained ministry but circumstances did not allow. Then one day, when I was working as a university chaplain in Scotland, I suddenly realised the time had come. I had a conversation with my superintendent minister (my husband) and sometime later we were wending our way from ministry in Scotland to Devon where I was stationed as a probationer in the Exeter circuit.

I remember David saying that ministry is a lonely job. I didn't fully appreciate this until these last two years. Clearly it has been very lonely since David died but that is not what he meant. It is the nature of ministry to maintain certain boundaries in our personal relationships and itinerancy means that we are always saying goodbye and moving on. Whilst stationed in a circuit you give your life to the work in hand and then suddenly it is over. You are off somewhere else sometimes never to return. But you never forget. Each church of which I have been privileged to minister has been an important part of my journey and I know I have always learnt far more than I have been able to give. This is no less true of my time here in Beckenham and I pray God's blessing for you all and all that lies ahead.

So now, like Simeon and Anna I am older. I am waiting. I am also waiting for a baby. A new grandchild is on the way. Many of you will remember my grandson Arthur (aged 4) 'helping' me lead worship one Sunday at Clock House and Bromley Road, well, he is expecting a sibling in the next couple of weeks and tells me 'I don't mind if I have a baby brother or a baby sister' – so that's a relief as there's no sending it back! I am looking forward to 'sitting down' (to use Methodist terminology for retiring ministers). It will be wonderful to have time to spend with my family. I too have faith in God's blessing and I believe that a whole, exciting new phase of my life is about to begin.

And I will have time too to reflect on my ministry. It is too soon yet. But I expect part of my reflection will be similar to my reflections on my time spent as an RE teacher. We never know the fruits of our work. We sow seeds and then leave it to God. I thank God for all the people who have supported me along the way, for the people who I have been privileged to journey with, for a while, and I look forward to wherever the road ahead leads.

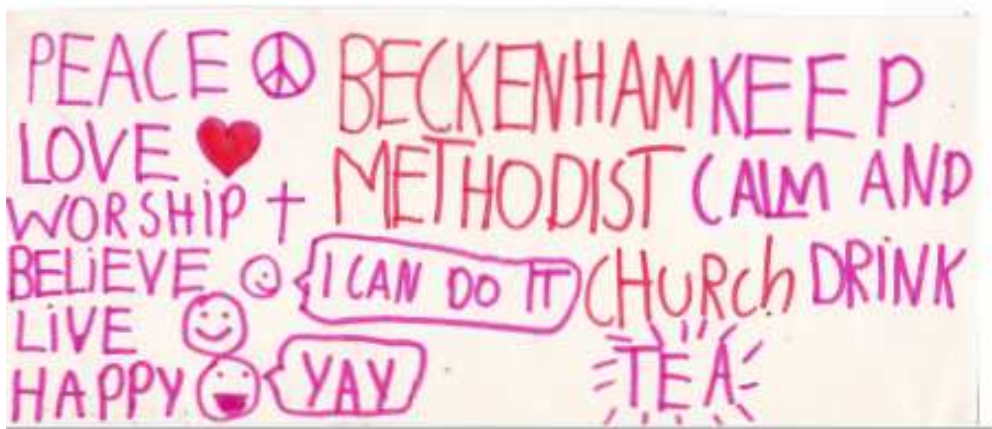
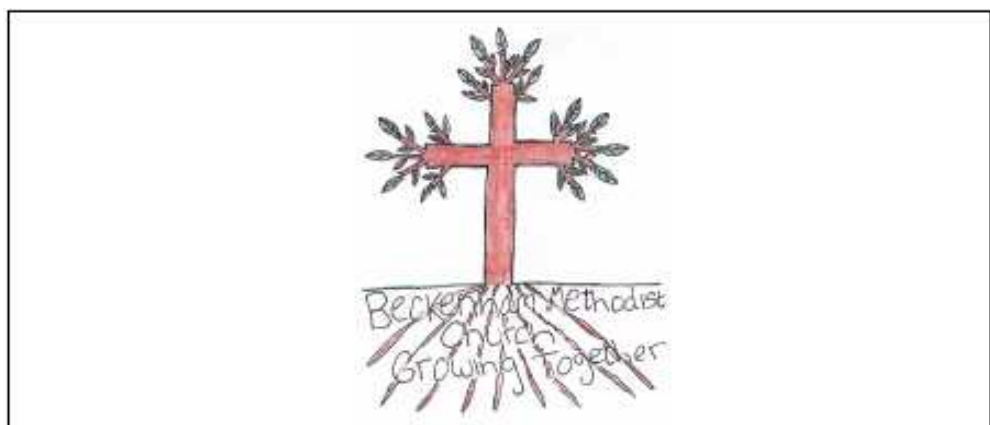

Following the Circuit Meeting on 7th May we are pleased to announce that the Circuit Meeting have invited the Very Reverend Ray Coster from the Presbyterian Church in New Zealand to come and minister in the circuit for a year beginning September 2017.

Ray will have pastoral charge of Beckenham Methodist Church and is a highly experienced and gifted minister. Ray will be coming with his wife, Judy and they will be living in the Bramerton Road manse. His appointment is subject to the agreement of the Methodist Conference and the issue of a relevant Visa. For the period of one year beginning September 2017

Revd Karen George will be Acting Superintendent Minister and will have pastoral charge of West Wickham Methodist Church alongside Deacon Laura MacBean, who will continue to focus her ministry on the church and community of West Wickham.

The circuit will be entering the stationing process in the Autumn of 2017 to seek a Superintendent Minister with pastoral charge of Beckenham and West Wickham from September 2018 onwards.

## **FULFILLING DREAMS**

I am therefore planning to go at the end of July for a 12 day trip. I will be fully funding myself, but any donations for the 'Hospice for Hope' charity would be gratefully received.

The **BECKENHAM JUNIOR CHOIR AND YOUTH VOICES** under the direction of John Webber were welcomed to Bromley Road on Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> May and performed to a packed church. There was literally standing room only with over 60 people sitting in the gallery and the enthusiasm of the young singers made it a great evening. The first half comprised a medley of poems and songs about London with many of the young singers, including our own Nehara Fernando, having solo spots. Each one was greeted with huge applause.

The second half consisted of the first performance of a Children's Opera written specially for the choir by one of its former members and assistant directors, James Olsen. "One of our brothers is a lion" was based around the story of St. Jerome and the legend that his monastery adopted a lion as one of its members. All I can say is you should have been there to witness such a great occasion with over 200 people in our church. We look forward to many more such events in the future.

**Witches and Wizards** is the sub-title of the next **SOUTH LONDON SINGERS** concert to be held at Bromley Road on Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> July at 7.45pm. As usual the summer concert is in a lighter vein and this year a bit different again. The Hammig String Quartet will join David Thorne (on harpsichord) to accompany the choir in the concert version of Purcell's Opera Dido and Aeneas which was written for a "School for Young Gentlemen" in Chelsea and first performed in 1689.
